Risen Indeed!& A Sending Word!

Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." Luke 24:39.

Early Christians used a powerful responsive greeting still used in our day during the Easter season: "Christ is risen!" The reply: "He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" Where is God in his world? In the physically risen and ascended Lord Jesus Christ! Luke's Gospel described Jesus appearing to his frightened disciples on Easter Sunday evening. He brings peace and suppresses their doubts by showing them his nail pierced hands and feet, inviting them to touch him. He also eats a piece of broiled fish to demonstrate conclusively that he is physically alive from the dead.

Again, Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." John 20:21.

"Peace be with you," he says. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." The assurance is this: Peace for our questioning hearts because of his saving death and victorious resurrection. The task is: Representing God the Father and his Son Jesus Christ in a questioning world. We too, are sent on a mission to tell the world that the answers to life's many questions can only be found in Jesus.

Lord, send me out into your world to show the world that wherever we are, there you will be, and wherever you are present there will be peace. Amen.



J.D. and Rhonda Reed – Health Update, March 18, 2018

Dear friends and family,

Where to start.

Well, first there are so many awesome things happening in the MTS Lain America

Program and the House of Hope, but we will send out another email soon to fill you in on that. We wanted to send a note to all of our friends and supporters and let you know about a situation that we have been dealing with for the past month or so.

As many of you know, both Rhonda and Nathan have Celiac Disease and have been maintaining a special diet for a while. In addition, Rhonda has been dealing with fluctuating Blood Pressure issues for a number of years that she has been managing with diet and medicine as needed. About a month ago, problems started getting to be more frequent and more difficult to manage and it became apparent to us and some trusted colleagues and family that she was at a point where something needed to be done. After a lot of prayers and the help of some great friends, we as a family along with leadership from International Ministries, have decided that Rhonda needed to return to the United States for an indefinite period of time to try and obtain a more definitive diagnosis and begin treatment.

She reached out and made appointments with an amazing team of doctors at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN, which is considered one of the best hospitals in the world for diagnosing obscure cases. After many tests and consultations, followed by an extensive discussion with her Blood Pressure Specialist, the team of doctors felt that she has some form of <u>autonomic neuropathy</u>.

What does this mean? Well, it is easier to tell you what it doesn't mean. It doesn't mean that we will be leaving our work in Bolivia. Lord

willing, we will be here for quite a long time. It also doesn't mean that she can't receive proper treatment in Bolivia. Sometimes the diagnosis problem is better addressed in the US. It also doesn't mean that Bolivia has made her sick, or that our family is falling apart, or that we are just trying to throw you off of the scent of some other family crisis. Honestly, we simply didn't want to share anything about her visit to the states until we had something definitive to tell you.

She will be continuing on in the States for a while to make sure that the new treatment is effective and then when things start to normalize, she will be heading back here to Bolivia, our family, and the work at the House of Hope. Please understand that while she is there she will be focusing on her health, so she will not be available for speaking engagements or church visits at this time.

Thank you for your prayers for our family. Please pray for Rhonda as she continues to work with doctors to develop the right plan of attack and get her back to Bolivia soon. Pray for J.D., Abie and Nathan as they are still in Bolivia during this time, and Grace as she is in University at Marshall. Know that we love you all and thank God daily for your support and prayers for us and the ministry that we are involved in. As soon as we have more information, we will pass it on to you. Thank you for everything, and most importantly...keep praying.

Author and Pastor John Ortberg shares an amusing story titled, *The Empty Tomb: How Will You Respond?*



"A friend of mine used to work as a denominational official in Minnesota. One of his jobs was to travel to little rural communities where they didn't have churches to do funerals. He would go out with an undertaker, and they would drive

together in the undertaker's hearse. One time, they were on their way back from a funeral, and my friend, John, was feeling quite tired. He decided he would take a nap. Since they were in a hearse, he thought, "Well, I'll just lie down in the back of the hearse."

Sounds like kind of a creepy thing to do, but this is a true story. The guy who was driving the hearse pulled into a service station, because he was running low on gas. The service station attendant was filling up the tank and he was kind of freaked out, because there was a body stretched out in the back. While he was filling the tank, John woke up, opened his eyes, knocked on the window and waved at the attendant. John said he never saw anybody run so fast in his whole life.

Ortberg adds, "When people see life where they were expecting death, they start running. On the third day, everything

changed! Where everybody thought they were just going to see death, there was life! And that shook things up! After the third day, as a matter of historical record, his followers, who were shattered, disillusioned, and heartsick following the Crucifixion, went out to face all kinds of difficulties and suffering and imprisonment and spread the Word, because they believed they had seen life where they were expecting death. That shakes people up!"
